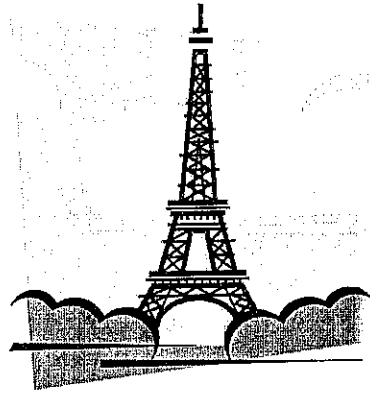


Advanced Placement European History Summer Reading



In addition to nightly reading from the assigned text, and supplemental text, Advanced Placement European history students are expected to read, summarize and explain the historical significance of the following two books.

Due first day of the 2nd Semester:

Michelangelo and the Pope's Ceiling by Ross King

The Sunflower: On the Possibilities and Limits of Forgiveness by Simon Wiesenthal

Format

Three (3) typed pages - 12 font, standard margins

- Name, class period, date, and book title on the upper right of the first page
- Two page double spaced summary of the book
- One page double spaced explanation of the book's historical significance

Points will be deducted for failure to follow the above format

Please note the first day of class you will only be turning in your 2 page summary for Michelangelo and the Pope's Ceiling and The Sunflower which will each count as a homework grade. The historical connection page you write will be turned in when we study that particular unit at a later time. It is then you will receive a test grade.
